Dr. Barbour has over 30 years of training and experience with rodents. This experience is not limited to handling, breeding and training of staff and students of several institutions during his career. Gavaging, blood withdrawal, IM and IV injections of vaccines, therapeutics, radioactive and infectious materials are also included. He has had technical experience in maximum containment facilities as well as operational oversight responsibilities of an ASBL2 and 3 in Newark. He had served on the Animal Biosafety Subcommittee at UMDNJ Newark and still serves as a member of the PHRI Institutional Biosafety Committee as well as various Institutional Animal Care & Use Committees in New Jersey. He has worked with non human primates for over 18 years. He is a certified & registered Laboratory Animal Technologist by AALAS. He completed the Institute for Laboratory Animal Management program in 1999.

He spent 22 years in the US Army- in medical research and veterinary units from the Vietnam Era through Panama, Honduras, Egypt, Africa and Desert Storm.

He and his wife raise meat goats and chickens on their farm in New Jersey in their spare time.
